

Rules of Graduation Requirements for English Proficiency for Undergraduate Student of Department of Occupational Therapy at I-Shou University

Adopted on June 2, 2009 at the second meeting of the
University Academic Council in the second semester of the
academic year 2008

- I. Legal Basis: The Rules of Graduation Requirements for English Proficiency for Undergraduate Student of Department of Occupational Therapy at I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the Rules”) are made by the Department of Occupational Therapy (hereinafter referred to as “the Department”) as per the Regulations for Assessment of Basic Competence for Graduation Eligibility for Students of I-Shou University.
- II. Purpose: The Rules are hereby established by the Department to enhance students’ English proficiency and to help students draw up plans for further education and future employment.
- III. Scope of Application: The Rules shall be applicable to daytime undergraduate students (including transfer students) admitted to the Department in and after the academic year 2009.
- IV. Assessment Criteria:

V. Implementation:

1. During the prescribed duration of study, students of the Department must not only take all courses required by the Department but also fulfill the criteria on English proficiency specified above to be eligible for graduation.
2. Students who fulfill the criteria on English proficiency specified above shall submit an application and the test report to the Department for approval two weeks prior to the end of every semester. After the application is approved, the non-credit bearing course on English Proficiency will be registered as “Passed.” Students who pass this course by submitting valid test reports are not required to register such course.

VI. Alternative Measures for Failure to Fulfill the Criteria: Students who fail to meet the requirements for English proficiency may take the courses specially designed junior and senior students for improving English proficiency offered by the Department or the Center for General Education on winter or summer vacations. The tuition is the same as that for summer courses. After the course has been completed, those who pass the course will be considered fulfilling the requirements for English proficiency, and the course on English Proficiency will be registered as “Passed.” Students who have taken any of the English proficiency tests mentioned above three times (once every academic year) will be entitled to a 50% reduction in the tuition, but for once only.

VII. The Rules become effective after being adopted by the Curriculum Committees at three levels and approved by the University Academic Council. The same procedure applies to any amendment to the Rules.

Note: In the event of any disputes or misunderstanding as to the interpretation of the language or terms of these Rules, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
